The Minibus Service to Ely run twice monthly by the Parish Council in partnership with Dial-a-Ride is set to improve. New times, effective from April, will extend the time in Ely to 3 hours on one of the trips each month while the second will remain at 2 hours. A drop-off and pick-up point at the new Sainsburys store and also Ely Market is to be introduced also.

SPEEDWATCH – VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT

The Speedwatch scheme, run by volunteers in conjunction with Cambridge Constabulary and the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Road Safety Partnership, allows the public to get actively involved in monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through their neighbourhood. Registered owners of vehicles seen exceeding the speed limit are sent an advisory letter from their local neighbourhood policing team, explaining that speeding is unacceptable to the local community. In addition information from Speedwatch activity can be supplied to the Highways Agency when speeding is identified by residents as a concern on roads within and through the village.



Burwell Parish Council are re-launching the Speedwatch scheme that started over 4 years ago in the village with a small group of volunteers. Additional volunteers would allow the speed watch activity to take place more frequently. Volunteers will be fully trained to assist with the sessions which usually last around 1 to 2 hours and can be operated on any day of the week within daylight hours and depending on volunteer availability. Also sought are volunteers to act as Speedwatch session Coordinators - to arrange and oversee individual sessions. If you are interested, please contact the Parish Clerk in the first instance.
